

Doctors Trauma Informed Teaching K-12

Trauma-informed teaching is an approach that recognizes and responds to the impact of trauma on students' learning, behavior, and well-being. It acknowledges that students may have experienced various forms of trauma—such as physical, emotional, or psychological abuse, neglect, or exposure to violence—that can significantly affect their ability to learn and interact with others. This equips educators with practical workshop strategies to integrate trauma-informed teaching principles through active learning methodologies. Participants will explore dynamic approaches to engaging students while promoting traumainformed practices. Additionally, the workshop will examine the effects of trauma on brain development and its influence on students' learning. social interactions, behavior, and emotional wellbeing in the classroom.

OBJECTIVES

- Understand the impact of trauma on student well-being and academic success.
- Explore the principles of Dramatic Engagers and their alignment with Trauma-Informed Teaching goals.
- Learn how to integrate Dramatic Engagers into everyday classroom practices to support Trauma-Informed Teaching.
- Develop strategies for structuring classroom assignments and activities to meet the needs of traumatized students effectively.
